I am not sure if the particular summa you are referring to is in our library. Can you provide me with more details on this book? If it is available to our covenant a commentary is certainly welcome.

A few days ago Silanus visited me on his way to the Provencal Tribunal. He may come pay your covenant a visit while he is in the area. He is one of my closer friends and you can trust him. You may remember meeting him during the early years of your apprenticeship. Please forgive him for appearing unannounced should he travel faster than this letter.
